# SUMMER



Dear Messenger Reader.

It looks like 'Summer' is now here for this year! Well, as I write this line, the weather looks summery out there: the sun, in collaboration with the clouds, keeps playing 'Hide and Seek' with me. Only two days ago I saw one of the heaviest downpours, and now I see the people out and about in their summer wear! When will I get the British weather right?

Considering that it is God who has the final say as to whether the weather should be rain or shine, I stop complaining and get on with thanking God for the ways in which He continues to bless us with His love and care. Whether at home or away on holiday - let us adore God - and not the sun - for the beauty of Summer. Let our love, kindness and patience not be because the weather is "brilliant" but because the brilliant God who controls the weather commands us to show love, kindness and patience to one another, as a way of reverence.

I understand church attendance in the U.K. drops significantly during the months of summer, purportedly "because many people are away." While that may be true, I wonder if it is not equally true that our local communities - for instance - also receive a good number of visitors, friends and families in the same period! I am not totally convinced that drop in church attendance, when the weather is good, is purely because members are away. I suspect some people simply subordinate church-going to either sitting in their gardens and enjoying the sun, or enjoying walking their dogs!

Another thing, I am greatly disappointed when I hear people explain that they couldn't come to church because they had their families and/or friends staying the weekend with them.

As a visitor I have enjoyed worshipping in away churches here in London, Oxford, Saint Andrews in Scotland, Seattle in the US, Brisbane in Australia, Katwijk in Holland, and other places.

In most cases I was accompanying the hosting families. Here at The Hyde, I have, indeed, noticed a few members coming along with their loved ones - an example that others ought to follow!

We must not be ashamed of letting others know that we believe in God, and that we enjoy a faithful relationship with Christ? We are not contributing to the growth of God's Kingdom if we are shy or ashamed of letting others know that God is in the centre of our lives. Matthew 10: 32 reminds us of the dire consequences: "Whoever acknowledges Me publicly, I will also acknowledge him before My Father in heaven."

While it is true that Christ does not force us to do anything, God's commands are for us to obey. Whatever you choose to do with God's commands, be aware of its consequence! This summer, choose to do the right thing in honour of God. Considering that there are many wrong ways of doing the right thing, pray that God might help you do His will well.

We seem to have lost sight of the need for us to always be true to the love of God; the need for us to surrender fully to the lordship of Christ over our lives. The church of Christ here on earth must NOT forget the fact that God's Words are often double edged: bringing comfort on the one hand, and challenge on the other - yes, even discomfort!

Should the church be preoccupied with singing the tunes of her subscribers in order to keep them happy, or must she sing the tunes of the good Lord, to keep Christ always happy? Whose responsibility is it - if it is not the church's - to call sin "sin", and to condemn (and not condone) sin in its entirety?

The message for you this summer is: Return to the Lord. Let Christ become your closest friend - one whom you are proud of introducing to others both home and abroad. It is not too late for you to let Jesus' Spirit free your life. Our church has now reached a point of real Revival. The Holy Spirit has brooded long enough within the life of our church. It is time we opened ourselves to the Holy Spirit's activities in our daily living.

That aside, I would like everybody who has not yet been baptized or formally received into Church Membership to see me or their Elder so we can start to talk around (and pray for) that side of things.

I must shut up right now and allow you to enjoy your Summer.

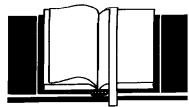

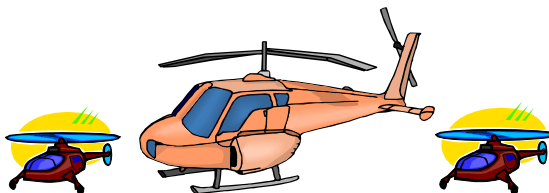

We would like to thank everyone who came along to Poolsford Road to support the International Lunch. We had a great time on a beautiful June day.

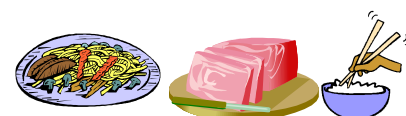

"Well, er, er, no, not really I don't have any thoughts about work, but God will provide!"

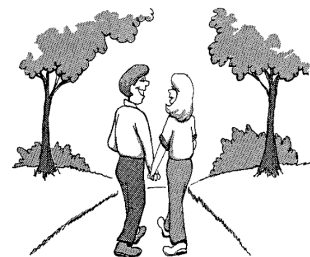
The father was getting very bothered about this young man standing in front of him wanting to marry his daughter.
